





The *Ars Notoria* is a mediaeval grimoire, or magician's manual, which was widely distributed and very popular in the 13th-16th century, but is virtually unknown today. It is however still very relevant in the 21st century because it contains detailed techniques to enable the practitioner to absorb whole subjects very rapidly, and to understand very complex subjects on first reading, as well as remembering whatever has been read. Of all the grimoires attributed to the Solomonic tradition of magic, this is one of the oldest and most enigmatic. Like many magic manuscripts this work was pseudepigraphically attributed to Solomon (who reputedly received the book directly from God via the hand of an angel). Other reputed contributors include Apollonius of Tyana who called it *Flores aurei, or the Golden Flowers*, and Euclid of Thebes.

The Ars Notoria stands alone in its own category of angel grimoires, for while most other Solomonic grimoires are concerned with the evocation of spirits or demons, the Ars Notoria instead was concerned only with memory and the ability to understand and absorb whole subjects rapidly. It offered to grant almost instant proficiency in any of the seven Liberal Arts, making it a key to obtaining knowledge rapidly. Yet despite its popularity and enduring history the *Ars Notoria* has *never* been printed in its complete form. From its early Latin appearance in Agrippa's *Opera Omnia* to the first and only English translation by Robert Turner in 1657, all published versions of this work have always omitted the most vital component of its operation, the notae, a set of complex pictorial illustrations that are the heart of its system. That is until now. This edition contains all the notae which have always been left out of other printed editions, without which the system just does not work. For the first time ever the Ars Notoria is presented here in its complete form. In this edition we present not just one but five complete sets of notae taken from various manuscripts, alongside a corrected edition of Turner's English translation, and comprehensive tables of the almost 100 notae variants.

This edition of the *Ars Notoria* features MS Bibliotheque Nationale Lat. 9336 which is the most complete and extensive text of Version B (1360-1375) of the *Ars Notoria*, containing both text and commentary.

The previous volume (SWCM Vol 11) provided the historical, scholarly and bibliographic background of the *Ars Notoria*, a translation of Version A and five fine full colour sets of the *notae* drawn from five different manuscripts, including BnF Lat. 9336.

This volume however concentrates on the Version B manuscript, but extracts the method of use, and integrates the images of the *notae* (missing in Véronèse) into a text re-ordered logically according to subject groupings. To be clear, this book is not meant to be read by scholars, but to be read by practitioners, or those who are curious to know how the method worked. This book should be read in conjunction with SWCM 11 as these volumes are complementary. SWCM 11 has a translation of Version A that was done in the 17th century by Robert Turner. One of the main problems with this translation is that Turner obviously did not regard the orations, the *verba ignota*, as at all important. He translated the Latin prayers carefully, but in many cases only recorded a few words of the orations, and omitted some of the instructions. The orations however are the practical part, the machinery as it were. This is rectified in the present volume where the orations are recorded in full.

It was originally intended that this volume would have a full translation of Version B and *Opus Operum*, but it soon became apparent, as translation progressed, that Version B was primarily a commentary on Version A, and that it did not in fact add very much to it, apart from many wearisome repetitions and duplications of instructions that already existed in Version A. This volume therefore concentrates on the material in and around the *notae* which is to be found in folios 18r - 28v of BnF Lat. 9336, which is the core of this method. The instructions for use have been explained and expanded. This volume has been ordered with reference to practice rather than to argument or citation. The endless repetative Latin prayers which do not add anything to the method have for the most part been omitted.





This grimoire was used by no less than 6 village cunning men, passing from hand to hand. It does not have a full register of spirits, like the *Goetia*, nor a wide range of pentacles like the Key of Solomon, but it is a blend of learned and village magic, including talismans to ease birth pangs, blight neighbour's crops, heal cows or evoke spirits. It has a lot of astrological data using the 28 Mansions of the Moon and image magic, usually absent from purely Solomonic grimoires. The 28 Mansions of the Moon belong to a different tradition which owes its origins to Arabic/Indian roots, not the Greek roots of Solomonic magic. This manuscript stands at the crossroads of these two.



Attempting to read Graeco-Egyptian magical papyri in Hans Dieter Betz's *The Greek Magical Papyri in Translation* is a daunting task, as they seem to be in no particular order (except for papyrus number) and seem to be a mixture of many different techniques, with minor snippets mixed in with serious and long invocations. However if you were to read them in the original Greek, you would soon perceive that the scribes have in most cases used a headword to indicate what kind of rite was involved, and have structured passages using the same method in a similar manner. What Stephen Skinner has done here is to separate and tabulate each of the 40+ techniques, using the headwords employed by the original scribes and magicians.

Reading the *PGM* in this way immediately gives much greater clarity. But a second obstacle to understanding how these techniques work is that the various passages have been translated by a wide range of different academics using no consistent plan of translation. In many cases the translator has taken the easy way out and just used 'spell' or 'charm' to translate dozens of different words which are technical terms which explain how the different magical methods work.

Stephen Skinner has rectified this by extracting each of these specialist Greek terms for different magical procedures and, showing what they really mean, dividing up the papyri into their constituent methods. The result is more than a guide to the papyri, it is a complete survey and explanation of the functioning of the different types of Graeco-Egyptian magic, often noting where such techniques appear again in the later grimoires, something never attempted before.

If you want to undestand Graeco-Egyptian magic, this is where you should start.


This volume is about the actual methods of Solomonic magic (a major part of the grimoire tradition) used in Alexandria and how they have been passed via Byzantium (the Hygromanteia), to the Latin Clavicula Salomonis and its English incarnation as the Key of Solomon. Jewish techniques like the use of pentacles, oil and water skrying were added along the way. Solomonic magic (despite its name) remained basically a classical Greek form of magic. Amazingly, this transmission has involved very few changes and the 'technology' of magic has remained firmly intact. This book covers specific magical techniques such as the invocation of the gods, the binding of demons, the use of the four demon Kings, and the construction of the circle and lamen. The requirements of purity, sexual abstinence, and fasting have changed little in the last 2000 years, and the real reasons for them are explained. The use of amulets, talismans and phylacteries or lamens is outlined along with their methods of construction. Solomonic evocation is explained with reasons for each step given including the use of thwarting angels, and the binding, imprisoning and licensing of spirits.

Practical considerations such as the facing directions and timing of evocations, choice of incense, cutting of the wand, utilisation of rings and statues, use of the Table of Evocation, and the acquisition of a familiar spirit are explained.

Techniques of Solomonic Magic is thus a sequel to Techniques of Graeco-Egyptian Magic. This volume is based on the magicians' own handbooks rather than the opinions of theologians, historians, anthropologists, sociologists or legislators. The emphasis is on what magicians did and why. Tools used by magicians in 7th century Alexandria, 15th century Constantinople and 19th century London are very much the same. More than 70 illustrations of magical equipment like the wand, the sword, wax images and magical gems, drawn from a wide range of manuscripts are reproduced and examined. This is the most detailed analysis of Solomonic magic, from the inside, ever penned.



The *Goetia* **is the most famous grimoire**, or handbook of sorcery, after the *Key of Solomon*. This volume contains a transcription of a hitherto unpublished manuscript of the *Lemegeton* which includes four whole grimoires:

This manuscript was owned by Dr Thomas Rudd, a practicing scholar-magician of the early seventeenth century, who knew Dr John Dee. There are many editions of the *Goetia*, but this one shows how the *Goetia* was actually used by practising magicians in the 16th and 17th century, before the knowledge of practical magic faded into obscurity.


This volume explains how the 72 angels of the Shemhamphorash are used to bind the spirits, and the correct procedure for safely invoking them using the dual angel/demon seals incorporating the thwarting Shemhamphorash angel. Equipment like the magician's Breastplate and the Brass Vessel made famous in the *Arabian Nights*, are explained and illustrated. None of this material has been made available in any previous volume. Tables of the 72 Spirits and their full attributions are included. Nobody interested in practical Solomonic magic would want to miss out on this volume.

The book also gives a history of evocation from Solomon King of Israel down to the present day, including the binding of spirits in silver or electrum urns, and their secretion in the Temple in Jerusalem. This is not the usual history of magic, but a history of the techniques used by less well known magicians, particularly in the Middle Ages.

Illustrations are drawn from rare manuscripts held in the British Library and elsewhere.





The Grimoire of St. Cyprian attributed to St. Cyprian of Antioch due to his reputation as a magician before his conversion to Christianity. This is not the more well known Spanish or Portuguese grimoire, but a Solomonic grimoire known only in one manuscript. It addresses the summoning and use of the four Archangels, Michael, Raphael, Gabriel and Uriel as well as the four Demon Kings, Paymon, Maimon, Egyn and Oriens, in their animal and human forms along with their sigils, a resource unique amongst grimoires. The title of the manuscript, *Clavis Inferni sive magia alba et nigra approbata Metratona*, literally means 'The Key of Hell with white and black magic as tested by Metatron.'

This is a complete history of geomancy, covering its various manifestations in different cultures, as well as being a practical manual showing how to cast and interpret geomantic figures.

Drawing on material from Latin, French, German and Arabic sources, Stephen Skinner explores the roots of geomancy in the Islamic *raml* divination of northern Africa, which lead to Fa, Ifa and voodoo divinatory practices on the West Coast and *sikidy* in Madagascar. The impact Islamic geomancy had on medieval Europe, and the part it played in Renaissance thinking and in the great astrological revival of the nineteenth century is followed by its use in the Hermetic Order of the Golden Dawn and its declining influence in the twentieth century. Western geomancy is not, and has nothing to do with, *feng shui*.

Techniques of High Magic is meant for someone just setting out on the magical path. The emphasis is on simple but practical, so it begins by diving straight into divination, in the first instance geomancy, which can be done with minimal equipment, at the most basic level a pencil and paper. For more complicated divinations the *I Ching* is recommended, and all the details you need to set up a hexagram are given (obviously you will need a copy of that book in order to interpret the hexagram).

The third divinatory mode is the Tarot, which is a core part of the Western Esoteric tradition, and a skill that is also very useful in everyday life.

Tattwa vision follows, a technique which was used in the Golden Dawn, and which gives the practitioner access to the Elemental worlds. This is an essential practice the use of which is a necessary skill for anyone hoping to master magic.

Astral projection is also explained and several methods for getting the knack of leaving your body to explore the astral are outlined. If you do not have access to a magical Order to recieve initiation then the twelfth chapter which offers a method of self-initiation will come in handy.


The last two chapters explain the procedures needed to invoke any of the pagan gods, and to evoke spirits.

The Ritual Appendices contain detailed step-by-step rituals such as the Lesser Banishing Ritual of the Pentagram, and the Hexagram rituals for evoking and banishing planetary forces. Finally it gives two rituals designed to stabilise and clear the practitioner's aura (Middle Pillar Exercise) and a ritual to clear a space (Rose Cross Ritual).

By contrast San He (the other great school of feng shui) relies upon combinations of the 5 Elements (in their yin and yang forms) with the 12 Earthly Branches, forming 60 *jia zi* or dragons. Much of the knowledge in this book comes from the Chinese text of perhaps the most famous Xuan Kong master of the 20th century, Shen Chu Reng (Master Sam) and his book on Flying Star entitled *San Yuan Ti Li Tai Xuan Kong*.



This book is a guide to the Chinese Almanac or *Tung Shu*, whose story stretches back into the distant past of Chinese history. It sells as many as three million copies a year, in Hong Kong, Taiwan, Macau, Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Philippines, and Indonesia. Originally called the *Tung Shing*, it was attributed to Huangdi, the Yellow Emperor (reigned 2698–2598 BCE). The traditional first date of publication is 2256 BCE, and this is mentioned in the *Shujing*. The art of selecting auspicious days was created in the Han Dynasty (206 BC - 220 CE). The most detailed and representative literature on picking auspicious days available today is the Xie Ji Bian Fang Shu compiled during the reign of Emperor Qianlong (1711 - 1799 CE). The core of the Almanac is a daily calendar based on the Chinese lunar calendar (combined with the solar farmer's calendar), giving advice on the best days to do certain things, such as marriage, travel, renovation, house moving or contract signings. This is supplemented by a fascinating range of subjects devoted to divination, astrology, feng shui, fortune telling, predictions, physiognomy, palmistry, talismans, herbal medicine, numerology, moral codes, stories, legends, and even pregnancy diagrams showing the development of the foetus over the nine months. The current format is derived from the Qing dynasty and has a continuous publication history dating back over 200 years.




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


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
